- * Continue to develop assessments to identify and review the needs of SEMH pupils.

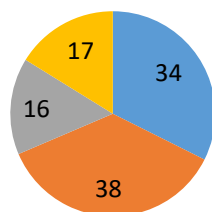

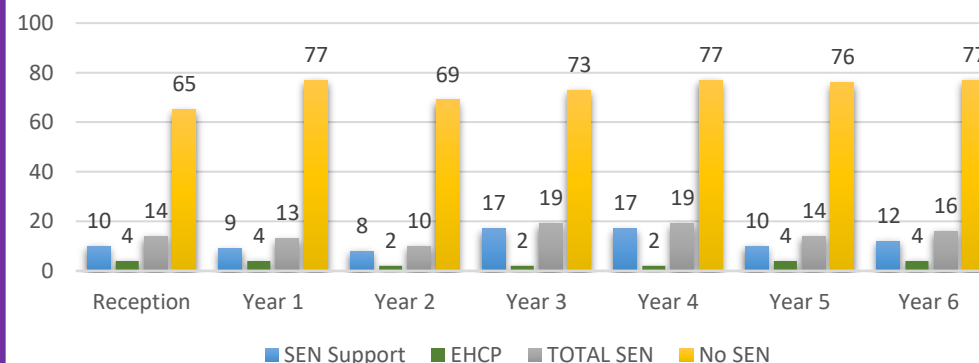

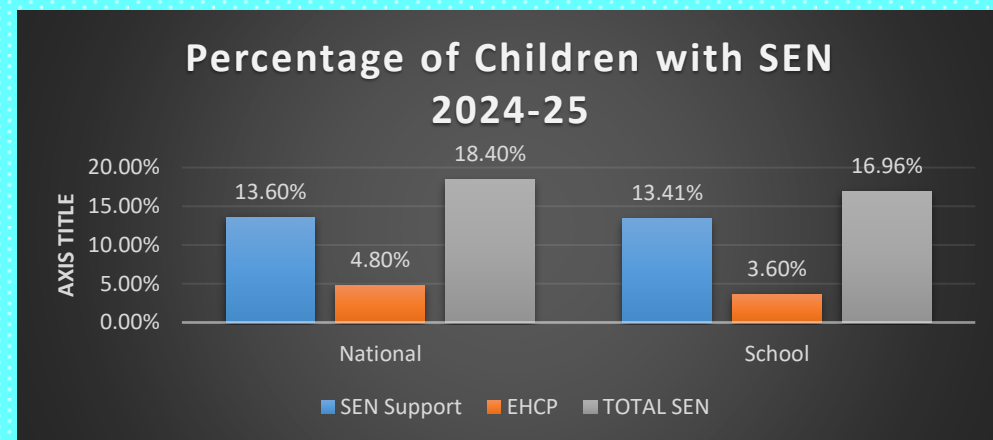
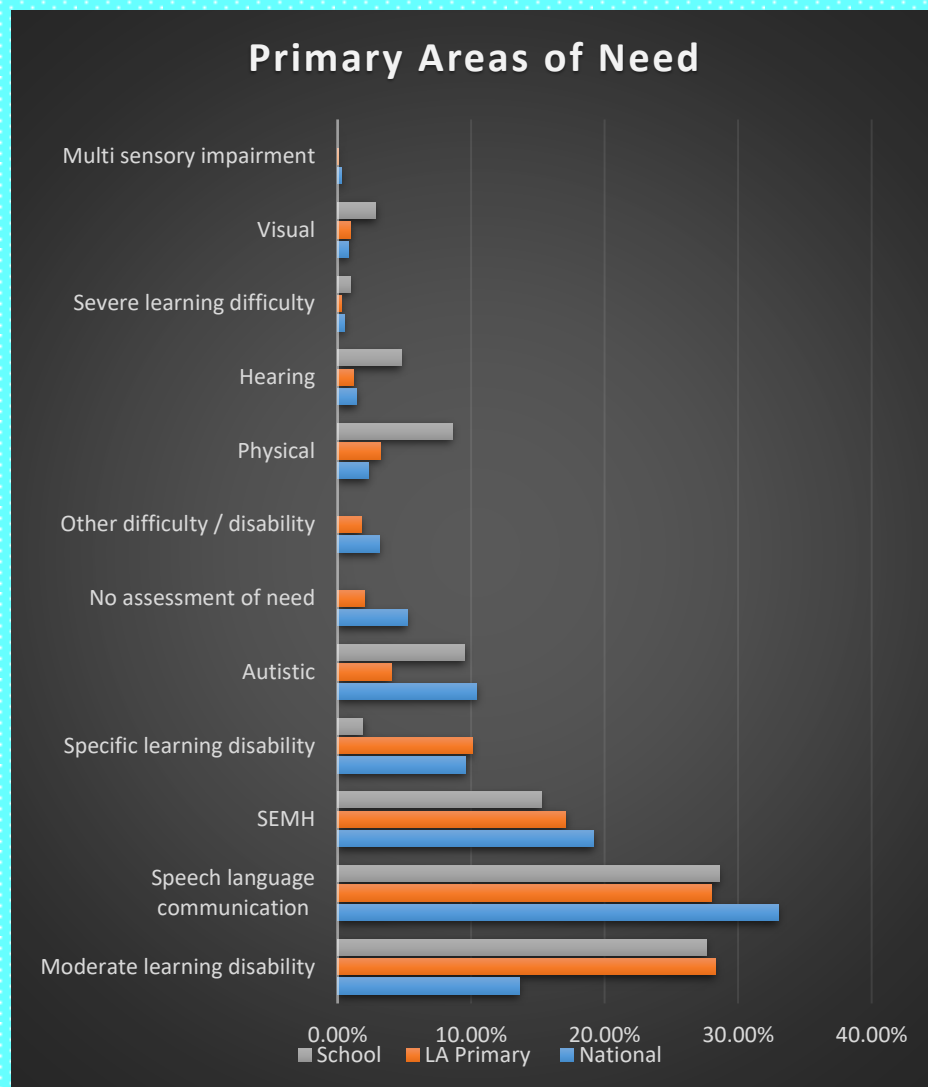
Broad Area of Need 2024-2025
